Odrasla sam uz Norveškog Buhunda no prvi pas kojeg sam imala u svojem vlasništvu te izlagala sa uspjehom je bio pas pasmine Njemački ovčar. Nakon što sam se odselila iz roditeljskog doma, moji roditelji su kupili Velškog Korgija Pembroke što sam odmah nakon njih učinila I ja. To je bilo prije 45 godina, a od tada sam uzgojila I imala u svom vlasništvu oko 40 šampiona pod prefiksom Annwn. Također sam imala I par šampiona u varijanti Kardigan te u Patuljastim Šnaucerima.

Od kupnje svog prvog psa sam uključena u rad Kinološkog saveza. Godinama sam bila članica Odbora Norveškog kinološkog saveza a te sam bila I član drugih odbora. Sada sam predsjednica Odbora za standarde te sam zadužena za prevođenje svih standarda na norveški jezik.

Licencu za suđenje sam dobila još prije 20 godina te mi je danas dozvoljeno dodjeljivati CC-eve (Cacibe) svim pasminama iz FCI grupe I I V te par pasmina iz FCI grupe VIII. Zahvaljujući tome sam imala mnogo zanimljivih suđenja u Norveškoj I van granica. U prosjeku sudim oko 15-ak izložbi tokom godine jer želim uz suđenje imati dovoljno vremena I za svoju obitelj, prijatelje a ponajviše za svoje pse.

Sudila sam u većini zemalja kontinentalnog dijela Europe, te Engleskoj, Irskoj, SAD-u i u Australiji, što mi je omogućilo mnoštvo zanimljivih događaja i prijatelja diljem svijeta.

I grew up with Norwegian Buhund, but the first dog I owned myself and showed with some success was a multi cc winning German shepherd. When I moved out, my parents bought a Welsh corgi Pembroke and shortly after, I had to have one myself. That was 45 years ago, since then there has been around 40 champions owned or bred by me under the prefix Annwn. I have also owned and made up champions in cardigan and miniature schnauzers.

Since my first dog I have been involved in club work. For years I was a board member of the Norwegian Kennel Club and have been on several committees. Now I am head of the Standard committee and in charge of translating all standards into Norwegian.

I was first authorized as a judge over 20 years ago and am now qualified to give ccs in all breeds, group 1 and 5, plus the water dog breeds in group 8. This has lead to interesting assignments both at home and abroad. On an average, I judge about 15 shows a year, no more are accepted, as I want to have time for other things as well, including family, friends and my own dogs. I have judged in most countries on the Continent, plus Great Britain, Ireland, Russia, the USA and Australia, which has given me interesting experiences and good friends all over the world.
