## MIROSLAV ZIDAR

Miroslav Zidar, rođen je 15. travnja 1941, te je aktivan u području kinologije zadnjih 52 godine. Uzgajao je Njemačke ovčare i Labradore je bio začetnik uzgoja Kraških ovčara.

Bio je trener pasa raznih pasmina 47 godina, natjecao se na međunarodnim natjecanjima, držao tečajeve za trening pasa te prezentacije za suce i instruktore za spasilačke pse. Osim toga, on je također držao prezentacije za obuku pasa za pomoć invalidnim osobama te je trenirao nekoliko pasa za pomoć slijepima.

Miroslav Zidar je također bio predsjednik Stručnog Odbora, Upravnog odbor, Odbora sudaca, Odbora ispitivača, Odbora za edukaciju te tajnik Kinološke Zveze Slovenije (1991-2000), voditelj rodovne knjige za sve pasmine te utemeljitelj uzgojnih pregleda i planiranog uzgoja u Sloveniji.

Napisao je i nekoliko knjiga o psima: Priručnik za obuku službenih pasa (1967), "O psih" (O psima) - sedam izdanja (1971-1991), "O kraševcu" (O kraškom ovčaru) - 1990, "Povijest Slovenskog Kinološkog Saveza" (2001), "Kraški ovčar" (2011) i autor metodologije tečajeva za trening pasa te je postavio teoretske temelje za trening pasa u Sloveniji. Također svoj doprinos je dao i kroz prijevod brojnih kinoloških tekstova.

Licencu za suđenje i rad službenih pasa dobio je 1963. godine dok je all-round sudac postao 1994. godine. Sudac za spasilačke pse postao je 1989. godine, Agility sudac 1992. godine dok je Obedience i Junior Handling sudac postao 1998. godine.

Bio je glavni urednik službenog glasila Kinološke Zveze Slovenije "Kinolog" kroz period od 7 godina.

Bio je član FCI Odbora za službene pse (1974-1979) te član FCI Obedience odbora (1997-2002).

U bivšoj Jugoslaviji obnašao je funkciju člana Stručnog odbora te Odbora za autohtone pasmine. Dugi niz godina bio je predstavnik Jugoslavije, a zatim Slovenije na Skupštini FCI-ja.

Što se tiče suđenja kroz zadnjih par godina sudio je:

Svjetsko prvenstvo za Velike Šnaucere u Italiji (Malnate-Varese), međunarodne CACIB izložbe u Europi u: Švedskoj, Norveškoj, Finskoj, Danskoj, Irskoj, Latviji, Litvanija, Estoniji, Rusiji, Ukrajini, Njemačkoj Austriji, Švicarskoj, Nizozemskoj, Belgiji, Luksemburgu, Francuskoj, Poljskoj, Mađarskoj, Češkoj, Slovačkoj, Italiji, Španjolskoj, Tenerifima, Portugalu, Bosni i Hercegovini, Hrvatskoj, Srbiji, Crnoj Gori, Grčkoj, Cipru, Izraelu dok je van Europe sudio u sljedećim zemljama: Tajland, Kina, Australija, Gvatemala, Indija, Kanada, San Salvador i Portoriko. Sudio je također i na Europskim izložbama: Poznan (2000-Poljska), Bratislava (Slovakia-2003), Celje (Slovenija, 2010) te Svjetskim izložbama pasa: Milano (2000-Italija) i u Bratislavi (2009-Slovakia), te Salzburgu (Austrija 2012).

Sve skupa je sudio otprilike na 300 Međunarodnih izložbi u preko 40 zemalja (te čak 34 je imao čast suditi BIS) i 42 ispita. 5 puta dosad je sudio natjecanje Prvak Prvaka /Slovenija - 1996, Izrael-1999, Švicarska - 1999, Slovačka - 2000, te Irska - 2008) Također je bio jedan od sudaca na prestižnom FCI natjecanju Prvak Prvaka povodom 100.-te godišnjice FCI-ja.

Miroslav Zidar, was born 15 April 1941, has been active in the field of kynologie for 52 years. He has been breeding German Shepherds and Labradors and has been an established leader of the Karst shepherds breedings. He has been training dogs of different breeds for 47 years, took part in international competitions, held courses on training dogs as well as presentations for judges and instructors for search and rescue dogs. Besides that, he has also given presentations on training dogs for aiding the handicapped and trained a few dogs for the blind.

Miroslav Zidar was also a President of the Expertise Board, Managing Board, Board of judges, Board of examiners, Board of educations for years and Secretary to the Kennel Club of Slovenia (1991-2000), the manager of the Stud Book for all breeds and the founder of the breeding examinations as well as the planned breeding establishment in Slovenia. He is known as the author of several books on dogs: Manual for training utility dogs (1967), "O psih" (About Dogs) - seven editions (1971-1991), "O kraševcu" (About Karst shepherd) - 1990, "History of Slovenian Kennel Club" (2001), "Krašt shepherd" (2011) and the author of the Methodology of giving courses on Dog Training and he set theoretic grounds for training dogs in Slovenia. Additionally, he contributed to the translation of literature on kynologie.

He was appointed the function of the International kynological judge for conformation and trail for utility and rescue dogs in year 1963 and has been an all-round judge since 1994. He has held the function of judging rescue and sniffer dogs since 1989, he took on the role of the Agility judge in 1992 and Obedience judge and Junior handling judge in year 1998.

He was Editor-in-Chief of the "Kinolog", Magazine of Slovenian Kennel Club for seven years. He used to be member of the Committee for utility dogs FCI (1974-1979), and member of the FCI Obedience Committee (1997-2002). In former Yugoslavia, he used to be a member of the Expertise Committee of the Yugoslav Kennel Club and its Board of indigenous breeds Commission. He is predominantly known as a former Yugoslavia and Slovenian representative at the FCI - Assembly.

Some informations about his judging in last years: World Championship for Gaint schnauzer in Italy (Malnate-Varese); International CACIB Shows in Europe in: Sweden, Norway, Finland, Denmark, Ireland, Latvia, Litvania, Estonia, Russia, Ukraina, Germany, Austria, Swiss, Nederland, Belgique, Luxemburg, France, Poland, Hungaria, Czehia, Slovakia, Italy, Spain, Tenerife, Portugal, Bosnia and Hercegovina, Croatia, Serbia, Montenegro, Greece, Cyprus, Israel and out of Europa: Thailand, China, Australia, Gvatemala, India, Canada, San Salvador and Puerto Rico.

He was judging on following European Dog Shows: Poznan (2000-Poland), Bratislava (Slovakia-2003), Celje (Slovenija-2010) and World Dog Shows: Milan (2000-Italia) and in Bratislava (2009-Slovakia), he will judge on World Dog Show in Salzburg (Austria 2012).

Together he was judging in 40 countrys all over the world more than 300 CACIB Shows (34 BIS) and 42 Trails. He was judging also five times of the Champion of Champions: (Slovenia-1996, Israel-1999, Swiss-1999, Slovakia-2000 and Irland-2008). In November 2011 he will be judge on prestige FCI Champion of Champions in frame of celebration the 100 anniversary of the FCI in Bruxelles.
